
CLASSIC PORSCHE 911 BUYER'S GUIDE 1965-1998

by Randy Leffingwell, published 14 June 2022 by Motorbooks

Let Book by Leffingwell = Outstanding Book join Einstein's equation in the pantheon of classic equivalencies. Leffingwell has produced a plethora of Porsche books and they are all outstanding. The text of this Guide is comprehensive and readable and is fully illustrated with excellent, large photographs.

Beginning with a general discussion of buying a used Porsche, which includes some interesting comparisons between the 356 and the 911 and 912 narrative paragraphs on checking individual 'systems' of a candidate purchase. Chapter 2 provides a comprehensive treatment of the ins-and-outs of Porsche Targas and Cabriolets. Chapter 3 deals with identifying and evaluating 'gray market' cars. They tend to be the proverbial 'pig-in-a-poke' and should be priced accordingly. Because a car needed to be special in some way to induce anyone to deal with the gray market importation process, these cars often carry premium prices based on what they are supposed to be. The reality of gray market cars is a very mixed bag. Caveat emptor in spades! Not only will the character of the car be in question, so may be the ability to register and insure it for road use.

Chapter 4 of *CLASSIC PORSCHE* 911 starts the series of year-by-read commentary with the 1965 901/911.




Every year-chapter begins on the lefthand page with a narrative about the marketing situation, the design/engineering considerations, and special characteristics of that year. The narrative is followed by detailed specifications and quotes from contemporary reviewers. There is also a Parts List table with prices apparently in 2021 dollars but relative values from model to model are still significant. There is a rating table comparing characteristics of models within the year in question, and usually excellent photographs of engine and cockpit. Next is a two-page "Garage Watch – Problems with (and improvements to)" photograph of an example vehicle, annotated with descriptive callouts to guide anyone evaluating such a car. Throughout the book, the year is printed on the righthand edge of the page, greatly simplifying the process of finding information on a particular year of interest.

There are 34 chapters dealing with individual years from 1965 through 1998.

Leffingwell has met the challenge of describing each year individually, different from the write ups of the preceding and following years. Having owned an '86 Targa for almost 20 years, I can attest to the completeness and accuracy of his enumeration of that car's foibles,

The "Classic" years covered in this book are going up in price. No one should consider buying one of these vehicles without availing themselves of the guidance in this book. Any Porschephile will benefit from the knowledge of the evolution of Porsche design presented by this book. Typical of Leffingwell's superbly illustrated Porsche books. It is a book that every Porsche enthusiast of whatever vintage will enjoy.

CLASSIC PORSCHE 911 is soft bound with 240, 8x9 inch matte pages with 200 illustrations. By the time you read this it should be available for \$32.99 from your favorite bookseller or from QuartoKnows.com.



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
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

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


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


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Yesterday's Future

any car enthusiasts got hooked building model cars

They might make a car from a 1/24th scale kit faithful to the car on the box. Or if they had several kits, they might start to take the wheels and tires from this one, use the engine from another, and create their own interpretation.

In today's vernacular, it might be an "outlaw." OCR member Scott Kuhne builds "outlaws" on the 1-to-1 scale.

PANDO: Your latest car started with a theme, a concept.

Scott: Yes, I have combined a 1983 Euro SC with a wrecked 1987 911 Carrera into what I call a "sophisticated outlaw." Over the years, I have put together a lot of cars from not much. Older 944s, 911s and even modern 911s and Caymans. I have been a club racer since 1995, and I've fully restored a 1970 914-6 that won 1st place in the Restoration Class Full at the PCA Parade in 2021. This is the first time I began with a mental picture of what the car should be.


PANDO: So, it sounds like you are used to working with orphans.


Scott: The SC had been parked in a San Diego shop for 20 years, the Carrera was a race car that had been wrecked in the right front. I learned of the cars and made separate deals with the owners. I brought them together in the shop in San Diego that I used as a base for the work. Which I do much of it myself.

PANDO: It seems you have a methodical approach to the build.

Scott: With this car, I started taking everything off. I used the SC as the basic donor car. I took the 3.2 from the Carrera but kept the 915 transmission from the SC...otherwise some major cutting would have been required. The 3.2 engine has been fully rebuilt, blueprinted, balanced. We did everything right, no short cuts. We updated the wiring and engine management.

PANDO: The race car provided the suspension too,

Scott: Right. Torsion bars, sway bars, shocks, Big Red brakes, Fikse wheels. Bushings and bearings were all sourced. Then I added a new fuel tank and system.

PANDO: One of the things that is interesting about the car it has a race feel but looks like a street GT car.

Scott: That is part of the sophistication. The body has been simplified. Painted Grand Prix White, which is familiar, then a pearl matte clear coat makes it a one-of-a-kind look. I tried to keep the interior tasty, we used suede for interior trim and OMP sports seats, it is a bit of a race car, but people can get in-and-out of the car without clamoring over a roll-bar.

PANDO: The car took about two years to build, now that is it done, what is next?

Scott: Keep it. Show it. Drive the wheels off it. It is smooth and comfortable, sounds great with the flat-six. No radio needed.

Many Porsche owners have had their car a long time, but special guest Guy Newmark of Manhattan Beach has had his Porsche 356 since 1966 and chalked up over a million miles of driving it.

The car first belonged to his father, who was generous to gift it to him on his graduation from college. He has had it ever since.

Guy is a yacht broker and so drives to San Diego for a client's interest, and then to Santa Barbara to check out another boat. He likens the 356 to a boat; no straight lines, curves to move through the air, as a boat has curves to slide through the ocean. Now that the car has a million miles (and counting) it has attracted attention from as far away as Germany and TV stations. "I love driving it. It is a lot of fun."



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ERAMDINGS Story by Lee Rice

I'm addressing some old topics and issues as I am evaluating things for the 911 all the time.

1 - Noisy and dusty-dirty wheels/brakes: I'm still using MINITEX pads (minitex.com/products) but I removed the self stick "3-M" self stick shims and installed the OEM "damping plate" for the 3.6 Turbo on the front and rear – so far they do work better for noise although occasionally, I get a mild chirp. They do make dust that is a lighter tan but it's not as bad as before. I intend to try some genuine 'ceramicpads.'

#2 - SILICONE TUBE drving up?


I am quite pleased to report that using a clean 3" long bolt pushed into my GE Clear silicone tube after using it, keeps it fresh over months of storage.




#3 - Asked about building a personal library for a newly acquired early (1972) 911: I highly recommend many books out there but there are two that remain as my number one and two: No. 1. is Paul Frere's "Porsche 911 Story, revised and expanded sixth edition." This book is easy to follow the birth of the 901 to 993 and the many variants and some particular model changes and their technical developments. It is also an 'easy-to-read' in your easy chair.

Paul Frere explains and writes about the significant changes in an easy-to-understand and interesting way. I use the latest edition as a first choice especially when I need a refresher to explain a technical question that I'm a bit rusty with.

And Bruce A erson's "Porsche 911 Performance handbook 1963 - 1998, 3rd edition" is #1 for fast references and looking up specifications. I've highlighted and underlined so many parts that I have fact checked against my factory Service Information, Workshop Manuals, Service Bulletins, Product Circulars, etc. And it is always right on.










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A Porsche Flashback


