

Treffen Scotts



n May, the beautiful and historic Camelback Inn located in the Sonoran Desert was the site of the Treffen Scottsdale gathering. We were advised that it was the first heat wave of the season and daily high temperatures hovered around 100 degrees. Best of all, it was a gathering of PCA members from all over North America.

Treffen is an event held twice a year, once in the East and then in the West. This relatively small gathering had about 280 participants. Thirteen of us were members of OCR. Registration was some months before, and the event sold out in less than 10 minutes.















Compared to Porsche Parade, Treffen is a more informal event consisting of social events and tours. The kickoff was a Cinco de Mayo reception which included drinks and "bites." "Bites" was a plate including an enchilada, taco, rice and beans and dessert. A number of attendees found sufficient food to make dinner of it. Thursday and Saturday were tour days. There were several choices of tours and all found at least some twisty mountain roads. Among other places, tours went to Sedona, Prescott and Mingus Mountain/Jerome. Pam and I chose the tours to Prescott and Jerome. Each of these were about 250 miles round trip driving. Lunch was included in every tour.

The opening dinner on Thursday evening was at a western themed area called Mummy Mountain, a short uphill walk from the resort. A western style barbecue was served and several attendees were dressed in western attire. Every evening after dinner a music lounge was available.

Friday at Treffen is "Navigator's Day Off." Many members went touring on their own to places of interest near and far. There was a social gathering in the early evening with drinks and hors d'oeuvres. Many followed with a shuttle ride to Old Town Scottsdale and its varied places to dine.

Saturday evening saw the closing dinner with some brief speeches by National PCA and PCNA dignitaries, followed by several door prizes.

Contrasting the informality of Treffen with the more formal but equally fun Porsche Parade, Parade is in fact the annual meeting of the Club. Parade includes competitions in all competitive events of PCA and many opportunities for social, touring and fun events. I would encourage everyone to try one or the other, or both!

ullet Harry Weber Motors and My First Porsche ullet

n August 1971, just a little over a year out of high school, I bought my first Porsche, a 1958 356A. The Dean of Students at my high school had a 1964 356C. He allowed me to drive his car and even keep it on occasional weekends to detail it for him. I was hooked, and had to have my own Porsche.

I found my Porsche in the 'want ads' of the Sunday San Francisco Chronicle. This was the best resource for used sports car ads in northern California (no internet back then!) A producer for KTVU-TV had his

car listed for sale. I drove the car around the Berkeley hills and bought it for \$1,200 that same day.

My Porsche was black with a black and silver interior. It ran very well, no oil leaks, shifted sort of smoothly and roared like it should, always in a lower gear than you might think. But that was how I was told to

drive a 356 Porsche. And there was a certain amount of double-clutching, "a no synchro first gear."

My Porsche wasn't fast, not at all like a friend's 1971 Dodge Charger. But I could whip around the curves on the back roads of the East Bay foothills and on Highway 1 from Half Moon Bay to Santa Cruz. I loved the fact that my car was glued to the road!

I did the basic service on the car, oil changes, valve adjustments, brakes, new plugs, and points. After about a year of driving, the clutch began to slip. This was not a repair I could do in my garage. So, I took my car to Harry Weber Motors, the BMW dealer in San Leandro. Harry was master mechanic for Porsche in Germany and was one of the experts on the early engines. He came to the United States to work on Porsche race teams and settled in the Bay Area as a technician and service manager at several Porsche dealers.

BMW was moving west and in 1964 Harry opened one of the first BMW dealerships in California. But he still worked on Porsche engines for winning race teams around California. At the dealership he accepted Porsches into his shop and had quite a customer following.

Harry steam cleaned my engine and the underside of my car. He tested the engine compression and then called me to come to his shop to tell me about my car. The engine needed to be pulled and was going to need a new clutch and a bearing needed in the clutch assembly for a manual shift car, plus the compression was low in two cylinders. The engine needed to be rebuilt. Harry spoke with a heavy German accent and as he spoke, I marveled at his white (clean) lab coat. Everything in his shop was spotless.

When my engine was apart, Harry called me to come to the shop so he could show me what the engine needed. There it was - completely apart on Harry's bench - as clean and shiny as it was when it was assembled in Stuttgart in 1958. Worn bearings, valves, rings, he slowly and patiently took me on a tour of my engine. A year later we did the same routine with my transmission. When the mechanicals were done and all 60 horses were book. Under the county was a second life. Used some head words appropried

were back, I had a new, much faster 1958 356A. I gave this car a second life. I had some bodywork repaired and had the car repainted. My car was so much fun to drive and it looked new.

After the repairs, I was on a day drive south from Lake Tahoe on Highway 395 headed to the Tioga Pass. I pushed my foot down on the accelerator and ran at a steady 85 mph. A red Dino Ferrari appeared in my mirrors and passed me like I was standing still but I was having a great time.

Harry Weber was an amazing Porsche technician. In 1970 he and his son opened the BMW dealership in Fresno where in 1981, I bought a 1976 BMW 2002. My first Porsche experience included a part of Porsche

history, Harry Weber, an engine and racing expert who started work for Ferry Porsche. As a customer, it was

always a good thing to drop off a case of German beer at Harry's shop for Christmas. Harry Weber passed

away in December 2003 and I remain grateful for his help.



Mhat's in My Garage?

ello, my name is Werner Puttner and I am a proud member of PCA-OCR for 27 years. I am originally from Münchberg, Germany. I moved to the United States in 1962, but prior to that I worked in Sweden as a mechanic and service manager at a VW and Porsche dealership for 5 years (1957-1962,) which is where I met my beautiful wife!

This is my black 1971 Porsche Targa 911S, but I also have silver 2011 Porsche Cayenne S. In the past, I have owned 10 Porsches. My cars are completely original. I perform all maintenance myself as I am a retired Porsche mechanic. I earned my master's degree in mechanics in Flensburg, Germany on June 25, 1957.

When I first moved to the United States from Germany in 1962, I brought my first 1959 Porsche Roadster with me on the ship to New York. I had a job as a mechanic at a Porsche dealership in Elmira, where I worked for a year. I then moved to Knoxville, Tennessee, where I also worked as a mechanic at a Porsche dealership for a year. From there I wanted to see California, so on I went. I got to California in 1964 and worked at Ballard Motors in Anaheim for 9 years.

In 1965, I returned home to Germany with my sights set on opening my own business. While looking for the right place to start my business,

Here is my 996 GT2 Ready to be Dry Ice Cleaned

f you're like me, you spend countless hours to keep your Porsche fully maintained and the paint and interior shiny and new. But the first time you put your beauty on a lift, "ugh, what is that? Why can't the underside of my P-car be kept in the same condition as up top?"

Solution: Dry Ice Cleaning. While not a new technology, Dry Ice Cleaning, recently launched onto the enthusiast car scene with various YouTubers showing off how Dry Ice can transform their rides. Dry Ice is also a buzzword on Bring A Trailer where 100 pictures of the bottom of the car is never enough. But really, what is Dry Ice Cleaning? Is it an internet trick or a real tool in an enthusiast's toolbox, like Dent Removal, Ceramic Coating and Paint Protection Film?

Originally developed to clean machine molds, Dry Ice Cleaning has been around for decades. Similar to Sand Blasting, only the media turns to gas, Dry Ice is much less harsh on surfaces. How does it work? A solid form of CO2, dry ice transforms from solid to gas in a process called sublimation. In the process it expands about 800 times creating some interesting chemistry. Dry Ice creates 3 different forces on the dirt you

are trying to clean; Abrasion, C02 expansion and thermal effect, freeze thaw. These 3 forces cause the dirt to 'pop off' the surface and fall to the floor as dirt or dust, with no negative environmental impacts.

We recently invested over \$75,000 for the equipment necessary to perform Dry Ice Cleaning. A 30-40hp compressor that will generate 140CFM (lots of air) with a dryer to ensure zero moisture in the air is required to power the system. The magic happens with the ColdJet PCS 60 Dry Ice Blaster that mixes dry ice with compressed air through a hose and gun. The ColdJet can shoot a 3mm dry ice pellet or grind it down in .1mm increments to a size as small as .3mm. This level of control enables the operator to use the dry ice to clean and strip hard parts like engines, transmissions and exhaust, and then dial it down to clean rubber, plastic, wiring and painted surfaces. It is crucial when selecting a dry ice cleaning professional for your Porsche that they have the right equipment to ensure your surfaces are not damaged in the process.

Porsches and other German cars are perfect for the dry ice process. Most, over the last half century, have been coated

with Cosmoline wax on the underbody to prevent corrosion in ocean shipping. This sticky wax is why your 10K mile garage queen looks like a 100K mile car underneath. Below this dirty coating, the car is practically brand new and that's where the dry ice comes in to gently remove the wax and not the paint or coating below. Up to now one had to steam clean or use chemicals like brake cleaner, which are not as effective and will change the color of the factory finishes while creating contaminated runoff that needs to be disposed.

Given the capital and time involved, the process is not cheap with prices of \$250-\$300 per hour for service. An underbody cleaning for a typical dry Porsche would cost between \$2,000 - \$3,000. Jobs for very exotic or intricate cars ranging up to 2-3 times that amount, if the value warrants. When complete, the finish can be left unprotected or recoated with a fresh underbody wax or a ceramic coating to preserve it decades to come.

The results speak for themselves, and what you see on the internet is real, you can restore the under body of that special Porsche back to practically how it left the factory.



y Daddy told me to see a Porsche... and I did!"

That's a phrase I grew up hearing every time anyone in our family heard the low, unmistakable hum of a Porsche driving by. Dad made sure we all turned to look! All of us kids knew that hum well, as we had all grown up stuffed inside either a 1957 356 Speedster and / or a 1972 911t Targa. Yes, I mean stuffed! As the youngest of four, you know where I sat, on the backseat hump, of course! Mom used the 911 to take us everywhere; friend's houses, the grocery store, flute and trumpet lessons, little league and softball, and even 'down the hill' to go school clothes shopping! Given that we lived in Lake Arrowhead, which was an hour roundtrip up and down Hwy 18 in the back of a 911. It was awesome. Mom drove that car in any weather all over the mountain! Growing up in Chicago, she had no qualms about driving in the snow and none of us will ever forget when, after being snowed in for a week, (8 feet of snow in Jan 1974!) Mom headed out to Jensen's for groceries. Dad captured this shot of her coming back home.

Not surprisingly, while doing my 'rural' driver's training after we had moved 'off the hill' to San Diego, the Driver's Ed teacher commented, "Boy, you really handled those curves well, you actually accelerated coming out of that turn!" What can I say? It was innate.

But I'm not the only one with stories to tell. Mom and Dad were AMAZINGLY generous and trusting with us all. Even as a 10 year old, I remember my jaw dropping when my oldest sister's boyfriend came to pick her up for Prom, and Dad let him take the Porsche 'DOWN THE HILL!' I can't divulge much else here in print, but now that we are all older and have grown kids of our own, the Porsche stories tend to come out at holiday dinners!

Funny thing is, by the time it was my turn and we were now living in San Diego, I wasn't

driving the Porsche. There were a few schools of thought on that, but the most annoying one was that being the youngest, I had never learned to drive the tractor back in Chicago. My sibs still love to tease me that that's why I "never learned to drive a stick." Actually, I did, and quite well thank you! Reality is, my older sibs were outgrowing their "first cars" so there was always another (automatic) car available. By the mid-80s. Dad had also started to realize what an investment he had in that 1972 911, and was tightening the reins on it. She doesn't remember the train ride, nor sitting shotgun on the drive back to the OC, but almost 16 years later (not surprisingly) she's asking if she can learn how to drive a stick!

Dad was thrilled the car stayed in the family as were my sibs, it reminds us all of Mom. It was tough giving it the TLC it really needed. With three

> children and two working parents, there wasn't much time for an expensive "hobby." The decision had to be made. Could we sell it to someone who would really appreciate and care for it? Or, were we going to invest in it and keep it in the family? Again, my generous husband made the decision for us; he could never pass up the chance at a good investment. We contacted Haydon Brothers in East Anaheim. Cooper Boggs had worked on the Porsche when we first bought it from my Dad, but when it came time to pull the trigger; Cooper said

the Haydon's were the right team for the job.

We knew that a complete engine rebuild was likely, so agreed that if we were going to do it, we were going to do it right. Well, as we learned, it is no simple task finding replacement parts for an almost 50-year-old high-end sports car, but we were patient (not really, but Doug assured me every time I called, "it'll be worth it Kim, you'll see). Doug and his brother Whit, had told me it was going to drive just like it did when my Dad first brought it home from the dealer, and boy were they right. With a complete engine restoration, transmission overall, new clutch and fuel system, restored drive axles, full brake restoration, and four new (but look like the original) tires well, it was almost brand new! And what used to have the smooth hum of a 911t now growls and has the power of an S! It is SO fun to drive.

So now when I back Mom's Glacier Blue beauty out of the garage, and head down the road, I can just hear the neighborhood kids saying, "My MOMMY told me to see a Porsche," and they did!

None of us will ever forget when, after being snowed in for a week, (8-feet of snow in Jan 1974!)






