
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Yosemite, California Bruce Sargeant

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Ny Red 1988 Porsche 930 Turbo,

fter my many years of racing formula cars, I needed a hobby car.

So, I searched the internet for a 930 and found one on a used car lot in San Francisco that was about \$12K under the market value at the time.

Incredibly, with what is now a crazy market, I only paid \$24K for it.

This 930 turbo was known as the "Widow Maker," as the strong Turbo boost could easily upset the oversteering of the car at speed and make another "Widow."

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My car never had that brutal boost, it just got stronger and was easy for an ex-racer to control.

Later I found out my car had an aftermarket KT27 turbo installed, which is an upgraded version of the original turbo and the KT27 is smoother and more controllable.

I only drive it fast in a straight line to clear the turbo, but its performance is fun and impressive, and it gets 'good looks' from those who are aware of the 930's reputation.

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t is an army bigger than Caesar's legions. Over 130,000 owners of the Porsche 944. It was part of the Porsche Transaxle movement from 1976 to 1995. Like the others, the 924, 968, and 928, front engine, water cooled, with a transaxle giving the car neutral and stable handling, and the most successful Porsche until the Boxster.

Meet Allie Taur and her 1988.5 Porsche 944 Turbo S in Alpine White. 2.5 liter in-line SOHC 8-valve four-cylinder with a single turbo. 250 horsepower.

While the 911 is famously Porsche, the Transaxle adherents are Porsche eccentrics and kind of like it that way.

Allie found her 944 like you might find a stray dog or cat. It spoke to her. A little scruffy, she brought it back to life with mechanical love; fixing the things to make it greater than the sum of its parts. The once overlooked, undervalued, an underdog, it has been brought back to life as how it should be.

t started so innocently. A group sitting around a table at the monthly PCA-OCR meeting at the Elks Club talking about how much we missed getting out, especially to drive our Porsches. With COVID lockdowns and fears of contacting the virus, we had all withdrawn. In the meantime, our Porsches were sitting in the garage just waiting to break free.

The solution was obvious...let's all drive to a remote location like a park or a beach and have a picnic. So off we went for a for a mid-week excursion to Mt. Palomar with a route that covered some lesser used roads. After a great picnic, we all headed toward home but not without discussing another trip for a longer duration.

Since that day, the small group has ventured to several destinations for a longer duration. They all have the same theme...at least one overnight stay, good food and plenty of driving opportunities along with a winery visit and beautiful sunsets.

We all want to avoid the major Interstates whenever possible and, secondary highways are plentiful in California. Once out of the shadow of L.A., there are plenty of fun routes and great destinations.

Just recently, the group decided to drive Highway 1 to Carmel and back. With Highway 1 finally open after a few years of repairs, early spring was the perfect time to go to avoid the tourist hordes and the slow campers so frequently holding up traffic. So off we went by way of Highway 1 through Malibu to Oxnard as our first destination. The only attraction for Oxnard was that it's a stop-over after a long lunch at the Paradise Beach Restaurant in Malibu.

id I mention dinner? How about Jocko's in Nipomo. It is so out of the way that only locals know it. They serve some of the best beef in the entire central coast, how about a huge steak cooked to perfection along with a range of Steakhouse sides?

As we headed west on Highway 46 out of Paso Robles, we get some of the most spectacular vistas of the rolling green hills covered with early spring wildflowers and the almost daily morning fog. But once on Highway 1, it's easy to remember why we have fought the traffic to get to the beautiful coastal scenery along both sides of the highway. There can be many stops along the way to take in such views as the sea elephants, the otters, the rugged coast and the famous Highway 1 bridges. And, we had to stop at the Nepenthe in Big Sur for lunch and view the best coastal vista of all. At long last, we made it to Carmel for our overnight stay to refresh and prepare for a long but challenging drive home. Up early and ready to hit the road, our route for the last day will take us on a journey of driving through many different road types, conditions and environments. We have chosen to drive Monterey County Highway G16 which starts out as Carmel Valley Road and ends up as a narrow two-slane road with many twists and turns as it passes over the coastal mountain range ultimately ending at US 101. With the many obstacles like bicyclists strung wide across the road to farm vehicles to the occasional oncoming traffic, the driving is tense, but the trusty Porsche handles all the challenges with ease and grace. And, this is only the warmup.

Up next is the east - west State Highway 198 that we will take from US 101 through Coalinga to I-5. This is a road worthy of any Porsche. With a twisting mountain climb to a race across a long flat valley, there is plenty of room to...well, let your imagination go. This east-to-west trek is one of the best secondary highway drives in central California. As predictable, I-5 is fast and slow like an accordion and it's a long way home, but we all make it home safely without incident.

To drive almost 900 miles experiencing some of what beautiful California has to offer in a Porsche has made the trip so worthwhile. If you have a Cabriolet, let the top down and enjoy the fresh air and warm sun. There are so many other destinations and great highways to experience so we will be driving again soon.

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Blue as in 'blew by you.'

t is a common story. But each one is different. Personal. A milestone birthday approaches. There is an opportunity to make a dream come true. The stars align. You buy yourself a Porsche.

Bruce Hallett bought a brand new 1997 Porsche 911 (993) in Zenith Blue from Walter's (today, Porsche of Riverside). Zenith Blue has an interesting cast to it with purple undertones. In bright sunlight it can sparkle.

Bruce drives the car. He has driven to Monterey, followed

the Luftgekuhlt events and recently showed the car at unSTOCK last November in Huntington Beach.

His car is not over-the-top modified, or even visibly "customized," it has been "personalized": Lowered to European spec, outfitted with Kenesis Supercup-styled wheels and a 993 RS gearshift knob exchanged for the stock leather one.

Like so many Porsche enthusiasts, you start to become a connoisseur of the brand. Bruce has picked up a second and third one.

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Bruce Hallett has had his 911 since new and personalized it by lowering the ride height to Euro spec and adding the Kinesis wheels among other things.





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..... The 993.

f the changes in the Porsche world, a teutonic shift was the 911 moving from air-cooled to water-cooled. The 993 was the last of the air-cooled.

The flat-6 of the 935/78 used water-cooled heads, as did the 956 and 962. The 1998 GT1-98 Le Mans winning car was water-cooled.

But for the 911 it was like the North versus the South. Patrick Long's and Howie Adelson's Luftgekuhlt fanned the divide and monetized it.

The 993 has become highly prized. The model is more than just an engine. It signified a new era, 80% was new from the previous model. The shape designed by Tony Hatter is sophisticated. Hatter, an Englishman, had been with Porsche since 1986, kept the 911 profile but interpreted it through elegant wheel flares, smooth front and rear bumpers.

The 3.6-liter engine has interesting technology using old school science. Porsche called it "Varioram induction" for the Venturi effect, which helps tap additional horsepower.

(Named after Italian physicist Giovanni Battista Venturi 1746-1822.) The passage of air is constricted through induction runners to add pressure to air flow in the low-and-mid RPM range. The result: Torque.

A multi-link coil and wishbone suspension put an end to previous lift-off oversteer.

Water, air, whatever. Dr. Porsche wouldn't care, or Ferry, or even Ferdinand Piech, what counts is performance. How fast? How does it handle? Does it win?



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
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Mount Palomar Loop Tour

Most of us have seen the 19th century photos on TV or in books of a long row of wagon trains migrating west over the great plains. Some 180 years later, today's covered wagons have evolved into a colorful and roaring line of Porsches heading south for a day's trek toward Mount Palomar in Pauma Valley.

This 145-mile journey headed up by PCA-OCR member Paul Shaffer and his lead and sweeper crews, left the Camino Real Playhouse earlier than usual to get ahead of the gargantuan onslaught of traffic heading south on the San Diego freeway. A record number 54 cars were divided into 5 groups.

Once on the 'S'-shaped corners, one had to be impressed at the sight of a long column of Boxsters, 911s, Caymans, Carreras and GT3s pioneering their way up the mountain. If you briefly looked past the spirited drive on Gopher Canyon Road to Canfield Road, you can see the scenic landscape and the rural valleys that have been left untapped by modernization.

Once all the assembly managed to sqeeze themselves in at the dead-end close to Mount Palomar, smaller groups formed and split-up to take optional routes to get back to Highway 76. An exhilarating drive, with lots of gear changes and hot disc brakes. On our way back from the desert-to-the-sea, we experienced an extreme temperature change from 101 degrees to a balmy 80 degrees at our destination of Joe's Crab Shack in Oceanside.

A huge shout out goes to Paul Shaffer for his first-ever tour! The number of participants in this fun run obviously screams for more of the same.
