

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# **Stuttgart Market Letter**

ough winds do shake the darling buds of May" William Shakespeare

We had rough winds in the Porsche market for the month of May. Despite offering the most cars we've seen all year, there were 585 Porsches offered on the various online and legacy auctions throughout the month. However, the lowest sellthrough rate year to date was 70% and the second lowest dollar volume was just over \$31 million. But not all markets were shaken by the winds of May as some, like the 356 markets, fared well while others, like the 992 GT market fell apart.

### The 356

The 356 markets remained strong with an 88% sell-through rate off of 8 sales with an average price paid of just over \$112,000. Now that might seem low for an average price, however, it should be noted that the offerings consisted of runof-the-mill coupes and cabriolets, not a special car in sight. But that's ok considering we didn't have any legacy auctions taking place this month. The top 356 for the month was a 1958 356A Cabriolet finished in a lovely shade of Meissen Blue and coming off of a recent, extensive restoration. Had the car had its original engine the price would have been much higher, but this sale for me is an indication of the strength and interest still held for Porsche's original.



### The Classic 911

Classic 911s (1976 & earlier) on the other hand had a difficult time finding new homes with only 59% of cars on offer selling. No one series of 911 stood out as sales were hit or miss but the top end of the market seemed to suffer the most with two notable no sales; one being a 1967 911 Soft-Window Targa 5-speed that was bid to \$226,000 and the other an original 1970 911 S/T bid to \$385,000. The S/T was a surprise as one would think that with Porsche's imminent announcement of the new 992 911 S/T, at least a collector or two would want to bag one

of the only 33 cars produced to complete the set in their garage.

But it wasn't just the top end of the classic 911 market that suffered from wind burn either as three cars capable of topping the \$1m sales mark failed to sell leaving a highly optioned Chromaflair 2019 GT2 RS as this month's top sale at \$585,000. The first was a very rare 1996 993 GT2 Clubsport that remained unsold at \$1,605,000 against a probable \$2m reserve price. The other two were models we've seen trade hands earlier this year, a 1988 959 Komfort and a 2005 Carrera GT which failed to sell at \$1,450,000 and \$1,060,000 respectively.

### The Modern 911

On the top end of the modern 911 market, we saw the 997.1 GT3s start to dip a little bit with an average sales price of \$134,000 and two out of the five cars on offer failing to sell 992 GT3s also continued their slide with new market lows at \$224,000 and \$235,000 and not a single 6-speed GT3 Touring selling for over \$300,000 as that ship has sailed. GT3 RS variants on the other hand climbed with the sale of a 2010 RS at a strong \$242,000 and three 991 GT3 RS' selling for an average price of \$211,000.

### **Porsche Cavman**

Cayman GT4s were a hard sell this month with a 10,000-mile 2016 GT4 selling for below \$100k at \$94,000, which is a trend I'd love to see for personal reasons, and a 2020 GT4 selling about \$5,000 light at \$122,000. And then there is the GT4 RS market... Two more cars failed to sell at bids of \$266,000 and \$245,000 proving that huge overs for the GT4 RS aren't in the cards as they were for their 911 brethren.

As I stated at the beginning though, it wasn't all gloom for May. We had a number of record sales such as \$123,000 for a 120,000-mile 1994 911 Coupe finished in Amazon Green Metallic, and \$81,000 for the lowest mileage 2002 996 Carrera 4S we've seen in five years. We also saw a 928S sell for a record price of \$108,000, about 4x the average for these cars, and a "normal" 987 Boxster S achieved \$52,000.

But while May might have been a bit of a disappointment, I am looking forward to June's auctions with the 75th Anniversary Porsche sale hosted by Broad Arrow Auctions at the Porsche Experience Center in Atlanta and the sale of the Gruppe P Collection on Bring a Trailer that includes a 1967 Porsche 910. Will we finally see an important Porsche race car sold next month? Stay tuned.

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


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

# Over 50 years of Porsche, and continuing... Story and Photos by Lou Leto

hile serving in the Stuttgart area for the Army in the early 70's, I was able to visit the Porsche factory. Returning home to SoCal, I worked for a dealership that included Porsche, experiencing many new 911s and stunningly original 356 models.

My wife Sherri Colligan encouraged me to stay involved with Porsche vehicles. We developed a habit of finding vehicles that always seemed to be located far from home, so our first experiences were long drives.

Our first, a 1982 911 SC coupe, was found in Las Vegas while on a business trip. We cancelled our return air tickets and drove it to our home in Utah. We were active with the Rocky Mountain Region of PCA. A few years later, we moved up to an '85 M491 option Factory Turbo Look 911 coupe in Guards Red, found in SoCal. First drive was a 12-hour solo drive all night back to Utah.

My international career allowed me to design and market high-profile consumer products. Special moments in the '90s included many product design discussions/debates at Porsche Design headquarters in Salzburg and meals with F.A. (Butzi) and Peter Porsche. Other professional and personal conversations about many topics continued when I was invited to visit the Porsche family farm in Zell am See.

Moving back to SoCal in 2000, the pursuit of a G50 gearboxequipped Guards Red M491 coupe was satisfied with an '88. We've treated all of our Porsches as daily drivers, rain or shine, along with track time on the weekends. We've camped with them in Yosemite, and enjoyed many road trips through multiple states.

We found a highly-optioned CPO 2013 911 Carrera S coupe just before the Pandemic, in Guards Red with Sherri's desired Luxor Beige leather interior. Located at a NorCal dealership, our first drive was back home to San Clemente.

Reading for years about the extraordinary handling and weight balance of mid-engine vehicles, I was leaning towards the newly-released C8 Corvette. Sherri once again came to the rescue, encouraging me towards Porsche. ocation. Location. Makes a car show. Last spring, Luftgekhult 9 found a good one in Mare Island near San Francisco. A defunct naval shipyard dating back to 1853.

It's been a location for film and television and is a big expansive space of old buildings looking for a second life as a gentrified, hip district. It prompted Luft to become a two-day affair. Luft 9 (air-cooled Porsches) on Saturday, and Air/Water (everything Porsche) on Sunday. (And two days to charge admission.)

Missing the mark in San Pedro last October, this Luft hit a home run. Luft's flair has become playing photogenic jazz by placing cars in picture friendly surroundings. Color, contrast, asymmetry, symmetry, light, reflections. It is Porsche photographic pornography for social media shutterbugs.

The first Luft was in 2014 and with this one, it has become a concours for Gen X, Y, Z: no grass or blue blazers, no judgment. It is Coachella Valley Festival for Porsches. The DJ played a hip mix proving disco-funk is not dead.

Luft has done a lot to accelerate the interest and price appreciation of air-cooled cars.

Luft's penchant for a veil of secrecy and close-to-the-vest, last-minute announcements to build surprise is losing its charm; that was fine when it was local, low-key, and they were feeling their rebel, outlaw oats. Not now as they have become mainstream.

Car identification was weak using QR codes without specific explanation. Unidentified race cars had no meaning for the uninitiated.

On one hand costs are reasonable, on another: not.

A \$10 application fee to register a car to show, if accepted another \$45. To drive it in, the driver had to pay \$45. Passengers and spectators paid \$45 for the 10am to 2pm event. Early, two-hour advance admission was \$110.00. For each day.

Luft organizers recognize the Porsche zeitgeist and have capitalized on it.



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# "We Are Porsche."

f it is not one thing, it is another. That is the case with events celebrating Porsche's 75th anniversary in 2023. Leading the charge is the Petersen Automotive Museum's "We Are Porsche" exhibit sponsored by Porsche Cars North America.

It chronicles the early days of Porsche to contemporary times and major moments in between. Broken down into nine segments, it is especially a history of Porsche in Southern California. Without the popularity of Porsche in California, its history would be different.

Three elements have to be recognized: motor racing, Hollywood, and the personalities of early local Porsche dealers.

The 356, and the Speedster, were mainstays to racing at Del Mar, Santa Barbara, Paramount Ranch.

Hollywood put the cars in the movies. Spritely adding blackand-white excitement to date night. "I'd like to get one of those." Consider who drove them, the cool. First James Dean, Steve McQueen raced them, Paul Newman had a banged-up one in "Harper," British actress Jacqueline Bisset drove the yellow cabriolet in McQueen's other car movie. And it didn't get pigeonholed as a "girl's car."

It is the colorful, the charmers, the early SoCal/European sophisticated and talented dealers that put the cars on the road.

At the top of the list is Max Hoffman. The Austrian who worked out of a Frank Lloyd Wright designed showroom on Park Avenue. (Not long ago despite the efforts of preservationists, it was sacked and remodeled into a bank.) Hoffman saw the potential of importing Porsches and took every advantage of it.

The Petersen exhibit features him, his anointing John Von Neumann (also an Austrian) as West Coast distributor, and Vasek Polak, a Czech who was a talented racing mechanic who became a dealer in Hermosa Beach.

Chick Iverson's dealership was in Newport Beach and a good friend of John Wayne. Gary Emory, father of Outlaw Rod

Emory (who is represented in the exhibit), was Parts Manager at the dealership for decades.

GARRARD

In Beverly Hills, it was another Austrian, Otto Zipper who sold cars to the LA and Hollywood elite. Drivers like Milt Minter drove for him at Riverside and around the country.

We shouldn't overlook other important Porsche dealerships not in Southern California.

In Florida was Brumos Porsche. Brumos is a smash-up of the early owner's name Hubert Brundage, BRUndage MOtorS. It became the hub for Peter Gregg, Hurley Haywood, and their famous "59," white-red-blue 911s. One is on display here.



rom Pennsylvania, Porsche dealer Bob Holbert put Porsche at the forefront of American road racing in a RSK, one is on display. His son, Al, acquitted himself on the track, winning championships and Le Mans three times.

Today the license plate frames of these dealers finish out the perfect restoration, and are at a premium price online and at swap meets.

Where have the personalities gone, to be replaced by Porsche Corporate's uniform chain-store identity.

It is important to remember Max, Vasek, Otto, Johnny, and Chick. Fortunately the Petersen exhibit helps.

hree of my Porsche loving friends (including OCR member Glenn Billings) and I went to the Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles to check out the new Porsche exhibit, "We Are Porsche". The exhibit features 40 Porsches celebrating Porsche's 75th anniversary.


Every kind of Porsche you can imagine was on display. I was surprised to see a limited edition 2018 911 GT3 cup race car specially made to honor PCA. A 911 Turbo Carrera from 1976 reminded me of the car my brother owned during that time. That car began my love of Porsches. The 1973 911 S that was used in Top Gun: Maverick, was on display. If you are into rock and roll, you might be interested to see Slash's custom Porsche. It's a beauty!

I was thrilled to see a 2021 Porsche Gran Turismo Concept Car featured in the Hypercar exhibit. The car was designed for use in the video game Gran Turismo 7 and is the first concept car designed for use purely in the virtual format.

The Vault is worth the extra \$25 admission. It features every kind of car you can imagine—even the Pope's car! You will also find the 1964 Porsche 901 Coupe. The 911 debuted in 1963 at the Frankfurt Auto Show so this car is the birth of an icon.

The Armand Hammer Foundation Gallery features artwork showing a collection of cars from the present appearing to be fossilized and discovered by archeologists. There is a full-scale Porsche sculpture that is eerily beautiful. It is "depicted as developing erosions and undergoing a process of crystallization" according to the Petersen website. The sculpture is made from fiberglass, steel, blue calcite, quartz, selenite, and hydrostone.

If you can't make it to the Petersen Museum in person, take a look at their website and you'll see a variety of Porsches as well as the sculpture mentioned in this article. The exhibit is worth taking a trip to Los Angeles to visit. We were sure glad we went!



# **Guards Red**

Arguably Porsche's most popular color is Guards Red. It has been on numerous models from 1974 to 2023. It is said its shade of red is the same as on the German flag. Recently PANDO spoke to some Guards Red owners.



It is a 1987 Targa. All original. We haven't really done very much to it, except we changed it to a Porsche factory radio, with all the new technology in it. And drive it. I have had it for three months. I was looking for two years. I wanted a Guards Red Targa with tan interior, I didn't want a black interior. It's got 148,000 miles."



It is a 1986 Porsche 944. Base model, with limited-slip. I bought it about a year ago. I ripped it apart to rebuild it. I love it. I still have some more business ahead of me. It took about a year or so looking for it. I really wanted this color; red with black Fuchs wheels and polished surrounds. It is not the fastest in the world, but it looks fast. It is all right."





Everything inside heals slowly; you find out along the way. And I also had internal radiation last fall and will do some external radiation at UCLA, Los Alamitos's Total Cancer Care Center, this May!

However, if I had understood that ACS (Active Cancer Surveillance) a lot better, I would NOT have waited to see if it got better! That was stupid on my part, then to the blasted Covid, the VA's lock-down and all procedures halted.

Later I sought Medicare help and went through a few not so good doctors but finally found an answer to a prayer and got HI/FU (High Intensity/ Focused Ultrasound) which obliterates the cancer in the prostate. It ain't cheap but it is worth it. Had I acted sooner, simple radiation would have likely done the same thing. But the pause, waiting was a mistake.

So, establish your own health prospective, then later on you have a better baseline. Pandemonium's "MORE THAN WORDS" is a great story about a great life RENEWED and the NEED for PASSION beyond the cancer mentality that overwhelms one at times.


Lastly: STREET TALK and the concerns of "AI" in our businesses, home life, social life, and Porsches.

It's ugly and un-a-door-able. My old 911 with the new and my own modified DOOR ARRESTOR got the best of my 'A' pillar door that held open single mounting arm and broke clean off! So, with my MiG welder and some thick steel served to fix that weakness in the old 901 door structure. I am getting slowly back into doing things and my report on rebuilding my 90-foot Purse seiner model. What a ton of engineering and wide use of tooling and resources. Remember keeping your passion active is just as important on a personal level and on the medical side.
