





Craig Barrett: When I was 16, I took my driving test in a 68 911 S...it had the dog-leg transmission, with first down where second normally is. The DMV examiner took points off for starting out in second gear...guess they didn't see too many Porsches. My brother made me go back and get the points I deserved.

Trevor Barrett: I grew up hanging out in the garage, not so much doing mechanical stuff, but appreciating my Dad's cars. My friends and I were into the Japanese Domestic Market (JDM) cars but had the respect for my Dad's 930 Turbo and gave it distance. No "Risky Business" or Ferris Bueller routine.

Craig: I am on my 5th Porsche (88 911 Targa Grand Prix White), and I have a 50th Anniversary 911. Before that was the 76 930 Turbo, 73 Triple Black Targa, 75 911 "S". I sold the Black Targa when we had Trevor to an 80s Playboy Playmate. I got a good deal in every way.

Trevor: I saw a red 911 Targa and that clinched me wanting one. I found a local car with beach air in the tires (85 911 Carrera Guards Red). It has the 915 transmission. I am keeping it close to stock; refurbishing the Fuchs wheels. I like the idea of respecting the authenticity of the car.

was fortunate enough to be born into a Car Culture family in the mid 50's. My father was British and a member of the RAF during WWII. Soon after the war my parents came to Southern California and he worked with British Motor Car (BMC) in the distribution of all cars BMC, Leyland Triumph, Lotus and Jaguar for the next 20 years.

Growing up in Newport Beach I attended the local schools, Mariners Elementary, Horace Ensign and Corona Del Mar High School. In fact, I was taught Spanish my senior year at CDM by Mr. Ken Fish! (He was recently featured in PANDO).

In the mid-to-late 80's I sold Porsches for the fabled Chick Iverson Porsche-Audi, this was the era when Porsche was pushing the 928's and the 944's and was rumored to be phasing out the 911. I recall countless times, an older "well-to-do" gentleman would come in the show room and ask "Do you have

Now a few decades later and a few Porsches later my son is a "Porschephile" and honestly, he really had no choice in the matter it was in his DNA. The Porsche Potion has been injected into him on regular basis since birth. Growing up he often left tell tale signs that he and his high school buddies and/or girlfriends had been sitting in my cars in the garage after their midnight run to In-and-Out Burger. He thought I never noticed.

Now he has his first Porsche 911, a beautiful 1985 Guards Red Targa on the cover of Pando! Soon after he bought it, he would show up in my driveway just after Cars-and-Coffee and he would say "Dad come and look at this area here, do you see the hair lines scratches in the top of the fender? Do you think we can get them out?" And I put on my +200 power cheaters and squat down to just the right angle and say, "Sure I've got all the stuff you need right here!"


Now he has all his own stuff, and wouldn't you know it, his car always looks better than mine! Isn't there some kind of Confucius saying for when this happens?

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Le Mans Celebration.

his month is the 24-Hours of Le Mans. This year, the organizers are celebrating the race's 100th anniversary, even though the first race was in 1923.

Le Mans is a spectacle. It is a test of reliability and endurance. Human and mechanical. The distances of a Grand Prix season are run in one day.

Early on British teams won, famously The Bentley Boys, winning four consecutive times. Then Alfas, Bugattis, Delahayes. After the war, Brits returned in Jaguars, the

late 50s and early 60s it was Ferrari, then of course, the Ford-Ferrari rivalry.

In 1969 Porsche almost won overall, they finished 390 feet behind the winning Ford GT40. In 1970 came The Win. But not the famous blue-and-orange Gulf 917s, but red-and-white of an afterthought second team, Porsche Salzburg.

Porsche has won Le Mans more than any other marque.

But it is 1970 everyone knows. Not because of the race, but The Movie. Steve McQueen's opus, "Le Mans." A Hollywood vanity project to go racing with his friends. John Frankenheimer's "Grand Prix" is a better movie, but

"Le Mans" is a racer's favorite and has become a merchandising machine. Any car McQueen sat in comes with a premium. The Monaco watch, the two-finger salute poster, the driving suit, the quotation about life. Three books have been written about making the movie.

This year the 24-Hours of Le Mans remembers its past, but it is next year's race to get excited about.

The regs are bringing back 10 marques like Porsche (teamed with Roger Penske), Ferrari, Peugeot and Honda (using the alias of Acura). I can't wait to go.










Porsche is in prototype testing for its return to Le Mans in 2023.

Racing Was His Destiny.

he racing fraternity; there is nothing else like it and OCR's Tom Malloy is a charter member.

Growing up in Los Angeles, it was ordained, it was his destiny. His father was in construction and built the Carrell Speedway in Gardena. At first a ½ mile dirt track, it was active from 1940 to 1954. Eventual Indy 500 winners Troy Ruttman (1953), and Parnelli Jones (1963) raced there, as did Phil Hill in an MG when road course events were held. It was between Vermont and Normandie, and today Artesia Boulevard would bisect it.

Tom became infatuated with the big machinery and tractors used for the dirt track, and of course with the racing. His infatuation turned into love, and that turned into a lifetime of racing cars, racing people, racetracks, everything.

Tom collects racing cars; mostly dirt track midgets, sprint cars and Indy cars. Each one with a category-stopping history. But race cars are inert until they are in the hands of a driver who persuades the best out of the car.

Walk with Tom through his collection as he recalls the history and why he bought the car, its history, its drivers.

Yes, the cars are mechanical, but with imaginative design and ingenious technology of the designer and builder who breathed life into them.

For example he has a Novi engine on a stand, and one in a car. The Novi ran periodically at Indy from 1941 to the 1960s. Named after the city in Michigan, the engine never reached its potential but had a lot of it. A supercharged V-8 designed by Harry Miller and built by Fred Offenhauser in Los Angeles (basically two Offy 4-cylinders with a central crankshaft and a screaming supercharger). Scary fast, some drivers thought it was dangerous. Tom's are perfect, and look ready to run.

He has the Indy cars that finished first-second-third at the very controversial 1981 Indianapolis 500. Not everybody can have a 500 winner in their garage.

esides his cars, it is the history of racing drivers that make his collection extra-special and personal. Like the helmets of the greats: Jim Clark, Parnelli Jones, A.J. Foyt, Andretti, Peter Revson, the Unsers.

He has stepped backed from being a racer himself for 20 years, but can explain the cues for recognizing driver talent: Precision and Consistency, hitting the same spot lap after

lap with the same poof of dust. And then there is The Want, the desire. And these days it is important to be Relatable with sponsors, media, and fans.

Tom's car tastes are eclectic and include a 1990 AAR Toyota GTP car and a Leyton House Porsche 962, which finished Le Mans in 1987 and 1988 in the top ten. Both cars were recently in the Historic Group C race at the Long Beach Grand Prix.

Not all of Tom's cars are "haute couture," and include "streetables" like an '81 Porsche 911 SC with 60,000 miles. All look ready to roll. Tom can't help it; it was his destiny.





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Mount Baldy Expedition

omparing Mount Baldy to Mount Everest would be unfair, but 20 Porsches and fellow PCA-OCR members took on the challenge on a much smaller scale, obviously. An 80-mile trip at just over two-and-a-half hours.


Our base camp was the library in Fashion Island with our expedition leader Dave Janes. New to heading up a tour, he had the best equipment for the climb. A one-of-a-kind GT3, painted in the 1959 color scheme of the LeMans winning Aston Martin green.

After splaying out on all the lanes of the freeway, everyone managed to single file their way off at Auto Centre Drive to our advance base camp at Starbucks in Glendora.

On one of those perfectly calm and clear spring days, we briefly drove onto the famous Route 66 and then started off toward our ascension to the ski slopes just below Mount Baldy itself at over 7000 feet. Along with the 30 degree temperature change from Newport to the finish, the roads also changed from divided two-way lanes to a narrower one-way road.

Lots of exhilarating switchbacks and first and second gear corners with three distinct super steep uphill hairpins. Exciting stuff, and like the Himalayas, breathtaking views all around, if you ever took your eyes off the road. Climbing up and up further made for a "spirited" drive; however, descending back down Mount Baldy Road was taken at a more leisurely and measured pace. Final stop was at Maniac-Mikes at the Cable Airport in Upland.

Our kudos go out to Dave Janes for his first-ever attempt at touring with OCR.










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


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
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
