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

ecently I was in Tokyo for the Japan Mobility Show in November and the Tokyo Auto Salon (their version of the SEMA aftermarket show) in January.



Tapping into the Japanese car culture has been apuzzle for me. Accessible only by car is the famous Daikoku PA (Parking Area), a highway stop between Tokyo and Yokohama where Japanese Domestic Market (JDM) enthusiasts gather at night

Daikaiyama T-Site is a hip host of events known to those in the know, typically the second Sunday of the month. T-Site is a complex centered around a busy high-end bookstore, Tetsuya; with restaurants and gourmet coffee shops situated in an upscale Tokyo residential neighborhood.

The Tetsuya bookstore's section on cars is deep, international and can absorb hours of your time.

Tokyo car culture has been far reaching: inspiration for "Fast and Furious" movies, "Gran Turismo" gaming, and the popular tuner market.

I know of three Porsche showrooms: one at the far end of the Ginza near the Nihombashi Mitsukoshi department store (itself worth a visit). One in Aoyama on the busy 246, near Gaien-Nishi-dori, a leafy street not far from the National Stadium, where Porsches and Lamborghinis gather Sunday afternoons. The third in Shiodome has a showroom, boutique, and The Momentum by Porsche, an epicurean-level restaurant (reservations suggested; porsche.tokyo). It is several ranks above "917" or "356" Porsche Experience Center restaurants in Los Angeles or Atlanta and, surprisingly for Porsche, reasonably priced. When I was there I saw a new GT3 RS up close in the showroom; it looked like it was made with LEGO blocks; with more orifices than a XXX sex toy.


Tokyo is two cities and can be seen best from a 50th+ floor hotel lounge at dusk, watch it change from one by day into the other by night. A spectacular transformation.










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
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Stuttgart Market Letter

anuary always kicks off the year with a number of great auctions from most of the major auction houses and it generally gives us a barometer as to what to expect for the remainder of the year. As it appears, the overall Porsche market seems to have stabilized with January's sell-through rate coming in at 68%, right in range of what we saw through the final quarter of 2023. We did, however, see a bump in dollar and unit volume as compared to last January with \$44,026,566 sold from the 592 Porsches offered

Of those 592 Porsche's offered, collectors had the opportunity to complete the "holy trinity" of hypercars as we saw a number of 959 Komforts, Carrera GTs, and 918 Spyders throughout the month. Of the seven examples of Porsche's hypercars offered, only three managed to find homes.

The 1987 959 Komfort offered at Mecum's Kissimmee sale was a 15,000-mile example that hammered for \$1,700,000, right on trend with other 959 sales we saw last year. On the other hand, the 2005 Carrera GT offered at Barrett-Jackson topped average sales prices selling for \$1,700,000 as well. This was due to the car having just 3,500 miles and being finished in the rare, and much sought after, color combination of Fayence Yellow over Ascot Brown. The 918 Spyder, also auctioned by Barrett-Jackson, sold just below the market average at a final bid of \$1,625,000. Failing to sell were two other Carrera GTs with high bids of \$1,252,000 and \$1,370,000 along with a 959 Komfort at \$1,500,000 and a 918 Spyder at \$1,650,000.

Hypercars

Also at the top end of the market, we saw another sale of Porsche's track-only 935/19, this time setting a new record at a final bid of \$1,626,000. We also saw a 911 Reimagined by Singer return to the million dollar club for the first time since August of last year, with a Namibia Yellow over Bone White leather example sporting an Ed Pink-built 4.0-liter hammering down at \$1,025,000. But that wasn't the most impressive modified Porsche on the market last month. That honor goes to a 1957 356A built by Rod Emory of Emory Motorsports. This Light Ivory over Green Vine leather "Emory Outlaw" features a 2.6-liter Emory-Rothsport "Outlaw-4" engine reported to produce 260 hp and sold at a final bid of \$675,000.

The overall 356 market looked strong bringing in a total dollar volume just over \$3m with a 75% sell-through rate. Aside from the Emory Outlaw, Speedsters and Cabriolets dominated the top 5 spots with a beautiful Black on Black matching-numbers 1958 356A Speedster selling for \$315,000 followed by 1958 356A Cabriolet finished in Ruby Red with a Black hard top selling

for \$292,000. While the Speedster looked to be quite the deal, the Cabriolet sold well above comps thanks to its known history and great presentation at auction. Of the cars that failed to sell, I was surprised to see a 1962 356B Carrera 2 GS on the list. Having just been restored, it was in absolutely pristine condition and only showed a handful of miles on the odometer since restoration. It failed to sell at a final bid of \$300,000, quite a ways off of what it would take to bring it home. The lack of interest was most likely due to the auction venue of choice and would most likely have brought all the money at a legacy auction or top online auction house.

914 / 6

Another surprise from January was the fact that 914/6s continued to struggle. Out of the five cars on offer, only two found new homes, both selling under the \$100,000 mark at \$90,000 and \$80,000. Two other standard 914/6s failed to sell at final bids of \$83,500 and \$110,000, the latter of which should have taken the bid in this market. Also failing to sell was a 1971 914/6 built by Brumos racing in the '90s for a customer racing program in the HSR series. It failed to sell at a high bid of \$110,000.


993 Targa

While 914/6s slid, one market that has been on fire over the last few months is the 993 Targa market with it's pricing trend line almost pointing straight up. Prices have gone from an average of \$90,000 at the beginning of last year to over \$120,000 today with three examples selling for \$115,000, \$164,000, and an impressive \$180,000, which set a new five-year record for the model. A 1996 993 Targa 6-speed was a special one though, as it was customized by Jason Castiota, famed automotive designer whose work includes the Ferrari 599, Maserati's GranTurismo, and the one-off Ferrari P4/5 by Pininfarina. This one-of-a-kind example was finished in a Dark Brown Metallic with a gold rear Targa badge, gold-colored brake calipers, a Turbo front bumper, and a split-grille rear decklid borrowed from a 993 Carrera 2S. On the inside, the car featured a custom handcrafted interior appointed with classic beige German square weave carpeting and a combination of chocolate brown and ivory leather upholstery. An absolutely stunning example for sure.

Based on January's numbers, I'd say that the overall Porsche market has stabilized and expect to see it continue into the spring. Although some models appear to be softening, I think it's more a case of them coming back down to reality after the insanity we saw in 2022. Our next batch of major auctions aren't until early March with the Amelia Island sales, so February will give us a good look at how the online auction houses are performing on their own. Until then.

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


Turbo Gab 2021

his 2021 Turbo Cab in Gentian Blue was ordered mid 2022 and delivered in late December 2022 at Newport. My son Jared and I decided to trim the "run in" period by soon afterward taking a road trip on New Year's Day 2023, cruising up to San Luis Obispo then taking Highway 58 to loop back home on the 5. Wow! What a glorious and eerily empty drive through the lonely landscape near Carrizo Plain National Monument. The sun was setting just as we were heading over the hills towards Taft, providing a gorgeous rainbow sky. Since then, the Turbo has been tracked at Chuckwalla (running more tightly with its sports suspension option), daily-ed around town and rallied with buddies in the Santa Monica mountains.

I found this rare example on Craig's list about 10 years ago when these amazing cars were still affordable. I have owned Porsches for the last 30 years and wanted something out of the ordinary but did not know what I was about to find.


The ad simply said, "Porsche For Sale" and telephone number. I almost ignored the ad but something made me look again and I decided to call. The seller answered and he described the 911 for sale. I immediately got into my car and headed to Chico, California, a three-hour drive after the seller promised me he would not sell it until I had a chance to look at the Porsche 911 Cab.

What I found was a low-mile 66K miles Cab that was custom ordered from Porsche through the Sonderwunsch Program. This was the Porsche "Special Wishes Program" where you could totally personalize your car. Here is what I found when I arrived:

- Paint to Order: Diamond Metallic Blue. Beautiful Color
- · Linen interior with Marine Blue seat piping and accents.
- Marine blue dash and accent trim,
- Linen carpet.
- Porsche marine blue 3 spoke leather steering wheel.
- White gauges.
- White speaker covers.
- White power window switches.
- Blue leather gearshift knob and boot.
- Blue canvas top and boot.
- Paint to match blue wheels with polished rims.

However, the car had been sitting on a driveway under a blue tarpaulin for two years and needed some real TLC. The seller was the original owner and placed the order for the 911; however, he was now unable to drive and hence the sale. I bought the car knowing this was a special find and had it delivered to my good friend Peter Sorenson of Northern California who is one of the best air-cooled guys I have ever met. We set upon bringing this amazing car back to factory condition.

I have never seen a duplicate of this car and it might be the only one with these colors with multiple factory custom upgrades. I spent almost six-months correcting the paint and detailing the car back to its factory condition. It has won multiple concours awards.

This 911 remains completely factory original with original paint, interior and has matching numbers.


Over the years, I endured the lonely life of a 996 owner with the "fried egg" headlight remarks, IMS dogma, "black sheep" image, etc. The value reflected that as well. There is some truth to having engine issues, as the M96 "D-Chunked" (cylinder wall crack) was replaced by Porsche; but the second time at 85K, they flat refused. That took me to the brink of the car's value. Do we rebuild or toss it? I was 13K into a car that might get a wishful 15K at best back then. Despite

the nit-picking, few ever say the 996 does not drive like a go kart. It was not a great investment then, but I just could not part with the driving experience.

I'm now at 135K miles and it's smooth as glass. To me, there is nothing like winding out along the shore on PCH. In the 90's it shredded Sunset Blvd from Brentwood to Malibu, all the way to Big Sur and Monterey. Today we cruise Laguna Beach by our current home. Fister exhaust gives it the "P-38 Lightning" sound with coil overs delivering the "go kart" ride. It's not mint, (looks good at 20 feet) it's reversibly modded, but none of that matters, it's my shift kit "man cave." Last year, when the doctors said I wasn't going to make it, I pictured myself driving down PCH (Porsche Coast Highway) with the top down along Crystal Cove. Sometimes when you picture yourself doing something it comes true. It did, and I thank God each day. This '99 996 is all I know, and in the category of a "no nannies" manual cable throttle driving experience. It's a Mulholland pleaser. All that analog feedback becomes an extension of you, and that makes it Porsche. So glad those twins came along when they did!





Blue Skies and Cabriolet Care.

What could be better than a sunny day, blue skies, puffy clouds, motoring on Coast Highway. How lucky to be in the OC.

How lucky if you have a Cabriolet. Smart Cab owners are good custodians caring for their top. Speak with those who know for advice. Here is some:

When not motoring on Coast Highway with the top down, keep the top up and fastened when garaged. It prevents the cloth material from shrinking, as it shrinks in the down position it can put stress on the mechanics as you raise the top. It helps to avoid creases which can turn into cracks over time.

Convertible Top cleaning tips.

- **1.** Use a soft microfiber wash mitt or microfiber towel with convertible top shampoo (Porsche convertible top cleaner or 303 products) to clean,
- **2.** Avoid using brushes whenever possible as they can pull out and unravel the fibers.
- **3.** Clean off bird droppings and other heavy soil as soon as possible
- **4.** If water is not beading when the top is wet, apply a fabric protectant or fabric ceramic coating to prevent mold or mildew (there is protectant from the factory but it wears off eventually depending on use)
- **5.** For plastic rear windows, use a mild car wash soap (Meguiar's Gold) and a microfiber wash mitt or towel. Be gentle, the plastic is very soft and scratches easily. Even a cotton terry cloth towel is abrasive enough to scratch and leave a haze.
- **6.** To remove haze or light surface yellowing, use a plastic polish or fine paint polish. Make sure to mask off the fabric top as the polish can be difficult to remove.

Watch the center and left and right panels for leaks.

The hydraulic systems raising and lowering the top can leak, watch for leaks just in front of the rear wheels as cues. (There are drain holes there and in the front by the battery well you want to keep clean of debris.)

If you do require repairs, use matched parts to maintain even pressure left and right. Parts prices increase as the car gets older. Use quality parts as labor can get expensive. You don't want to have to fix it twice.

OK you lucky Cabrioleters, the weather is getting better, enjoy it on the road.
