

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

Report

s expected, August toppled all previous months of this year in terms of dollar volume and unit volume as 680 cars ran through the various auctions both online and in-person with \$58,551,955 in sales thanks to the auctions at Monterey's Car Week. The real surprise was the 66% sell-through rate, which is the lowest thus far in 2023.

Low-sell Through

Monterey, by itself, could be classified as a rough week for the Porsche Market, as only 61% of cars offered found new homes. The top of the market took the biggest hit, with cars over \$1m selling at only a 50% sell-through rate, with not a single car over \$2m hammering sold. We saw similar results online, with only one million-dollar car selling out of the five offered during the month. Only two of the \$1m+ cars sold were vintage race cars, with the rest being modern classics, a theme we've seen this year played out in auction after auction.

356s Selling

In August, we saw more 356s cross the block than in any other month in memory, with a total of 50 cars, 33 of which sold. After a solid recent price run, the 356 market shows signs of softening as several cars brought final bids on the lower pricing side. One example would be the 1956 356A 1500 GS Carrera Speedster that sold for \$850,000 at Mecum. This time last year, we saw a GS/GT example hammer down at \$1,325,000, quite a price difference. We've also had several recent online sales on the softer side, with a 1965 356C Coupe in superb condition bringing only \$126,000 when these were recently going for over \$130k.

Of the three examples 911 Turbos offered, none found homes showing that they are either too 911 Turbos were a mixed bag, with only half of the early 930s new to be considered collectible race cars or sellers had hopes finding homes and the average price hovering just over \$150k, of much higher prices. Probably a combination of both. thanks partly to the \$405,000 and \$267,500 paid for a pair of 1979 examples. Others hovered in the \$130k range, with a low As I write this, it is still too early to tell what September will of \$90,000 paid for a 1978 911 Turbo. Later, 3.3-liter 930s bring as we're in the midst of a holiday weekend. But if August looked flat with an exceptional car, the very first 911 Turbo is any indication, I wouldn't be surprised if our sell-through Slant Nose, failing to sell at a high bid of \$181,000. That car rate remains below 70% and we start to see some new lows was most likely about \$100k short of where it needed to be, as achieved for cars that have been climbing since COVID. it's such a significant part of Porsche's Turbo history.

964 Turbos continued their climb, with average prices fo 3.3-liter cars cresting the \$180,000 mark and 3.6-liter cars ove

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\$330,000. Surprisingly, a 1994 911 Turbo S 3.8 only brought \$800,000, as these cars have been in the \$1m range until the past two months. 993 Turbo and Turbo S' also had a strong showing, with the lowest price paid being \$160,000 for a modified 1996 example repainted in Blue. On the other side of the coin, we had a new record achieved at \$810,000 for a sub-2,000-mile 1997 Turbo S finished in Cobalt with racing stripes to match the original owner's 917 and 935 race cars.



This 1966 Porsche 906 Carrera 6, offered by Bonhams at their Monterey auction, was the highest sale for the month of August at \$1,850,000.

992 GT3s continued their slide with several bids in the \$240k range, and only one Touring example selling for over \$300k at Gooding & Co. The 991.1 GT3 RS showed some strength with an average sales price of around \$200k. Where the GT

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y 356 began its automotive life in Oregon where it was owned and driven for many years until being purchased by Dave Navon of AirCooled Classics in 2020. David repainted it Slate Gray (it's original color), added Outlaw features and did a redo of the interior and upholstery prior to me buying it in mid-2021. I entered it into the Dana Point Classic Car Show in October of 2021 where it won the Best European Modified class.

The car's performance, handling, seating, etc., left a great deal to be desired and I brought it to Dave Schmidt of Honest Engine in Costa Mesa for his assessment. We decided to rebuild the engine to 1925 cc specifications using Mahle pistons and cylinders and Carillo rods, plus a new cam giving better lower-end torque. I sent the transmission to Vic Skirmants who had COVID at the time and was actually in the hospital when I first spoke to Barbara. After several months of e-mailing, phone calls and letter writing, Vic was fully recovered and he completely rebuilt the 4-speed using all new Speedster gearing.

As my checking account was gradually going underwater, it was suggested that we could convert to 12-volt power and an alternator so that we could change all the lighting to LED. Why not! While we were at it, we also upgraded the suspension using Bilstein shocks, added 4 wheel discs brakes and put in an electronic fire system and a new two-tone horn. New wheels and tires quickly followed along with changing out the regular 356 seats for custom built Speedster seats, courtesy of Fibersteel who also matched the existing red and pepita upholstery theme. By now I was looking to obtain a second mortgage, but had a truly spectacular looking and performing 356 Super 90 Outlaw referred to as a "Carrera GT" and by my wife as the "bug."

In addition, the 356 is numbers matching with a Porsche Certificate of Authenticity. The car is now a joy to drive, has power galore and well spaced gearing for both acceleration and top speed. Vic's a genius in this area!

I am very proud of our joint achievement and feel certain that it will continue to turn heads. I am still recovering financially as my budget went out the window after the engine rebuild.



A 911 Viper

y car is a 1973 911T. The original color was the Viper Green and it has a very high-quality repaint in Viper Green, almost Concours.

The seats are custom-made to be light, yet comfortable. There is a roll cage on the inside that is tied into the actual chassis. This car on a short course out performs my 911 GT3RS, it's mind-blowing. It has a special race engine,* hand-built by Peter Dawe and makes 300 hp to the wheels. The compression is 11.5-to-1. It revs so fast, faster than anything else I own. It's absolutely thrilling to drive. It has a five speed 915 transmission with an extremely light flywheel. The engine was built on a 964 case, has two oil coolers, rubber oil lines, titanium parts, etc. The flares are real RS flares as the Porsche factory used to sell these. The suspension and the engine is magic. The suspension is a conversion to coil-overs JRZ and other parts, and is stiff in corners like it's a train on rails, yet you do not feel so many of the little bumps because the suspension takes care of it. It's really an old car coming together with modern





technology to look, feel and give the sensations of the old car, yet gives the speed, reliability and performance of a new car.

All brakes are updated to the biggest and best of what would fit. The front end is so light, when driving these old long hoods, there's nothing that matches the feeling. The wheels were complicated to build to put a specific tire on the car. The centers are real Fuchs and the lips are BBS wheels, then they were welded together so we could put the tires on we needed.

Peter Dawe built the car and engine. Gasworks did the work on the car and John Benton brought the car all together.
