



### Volkswagen Beetles and Buses


#### **Smaller and Smarter**

By Russell Hayes, published 2020 by Motorbooks, Beverly, MA

Printed in 'European Style' with lots of white space on the pages, the beautiful pages are achieved in part by using a small font. You won't necessarily need a magnifying glass, but make sure your 'readers' are handy. Another annoyance is there is no caption for the interesting inside and outside cover pictures, and the Image Credits are given by alphabetical order by vendor, not by page.

The story begins with the 'People's Car' as virtually a marketing tool for Hitler's Democrat Socialist Party, and how - after the war - no existing European or American car company was willing to get involved in running Volkswagen. But the British government desperately needed vehicles to enable its personnel to get around the British Zone. After examining an early Beetle, officials ordered a batch of 20,000 cars from the factory in August 1945, and they doubled that number several weeks later. By the time those orders were filled, Volkswagen, virtually an employeeowned company, was a viable business. Incidentally, this past December 27th was the 75th anniversary of one of the most important dates in VW history - series production of the Type 1 (which we know as The Beetle,) was launched on December 27, 1945.

Roughly one year after Beetle production became significant, the 'cargo vehicles' Transporter, Kombi and Microbus, joined by the Samba in '51 (who remembers what the differences are?) entered production. Today the production figures from the ancient early '50s seem huge – 62,500 'vans' in 1956 alone, with a comparable number of Beetles – figures that would skyrocket by the '70s.



The eight chapters including Not Like the Other Ones, Early Beetle Folks and Screen and Gallery, tend to be topic-focused rather than strictly chronological, and also tend to skip around from Beetle to Bus and back again. A great deal of historical data on design, production quantities and prices are included. Despite these details, this book is more a collection of anecdotes about Beetles and Buses than an encyclopedic history.

**BEETLES AND BUSES** details the various specialized commercial versions of the 'van & pickup' models, and the camper versions first as kits then as completed vehicles. There is a discussion of all electric and hybrid vans and pickups produced in small developmental quantities in the early '70s, but dropped after the fuel crisis ended. Interestingly, mention of the last German Beetle -16,255,500 built on January 19, 1978, and the last Beetle convertible 330,281 on 10 January 1979 occur on page 108 of this 176page book. The VW story is bigger than most Americans realize. Even the almost extinct air-cooled van sold 4,800,000 units between 1967 and 1979.

One entire chapter is devoted to VWs in movies; bit parts exclusively until the Love Bug series made the car the star. The origin of the name Herbie turns out to be very mundane, but it took eleven different

vehicles to perform Herbie's various tricks in the first film. There is also a chapter on iconic pictures and album covers that, intentionally or unintentionally, show VWs in the background.

Extensive discussion of the Beach Buggy and Baja Bug phenomena explains how VoA first tried to distance itself from these heretics then came to embrace at least the Baja versions. The Cal Look and the Hippie Buses are also discussed, but from a somewhat British viewpoint.

There is considerable discussion of the eco-politics of Beetle production in Brazil and Mexico. The New Beetle is included, described as designed in Simi Valley, CA, and first produced in Mexico. Detailed stories of a few owner experiences are included to illustrate or explain the VW lifestyle. One story makes reference to a VW/German auto garage in Laguna Canyon.

BEETLES AND BUSES has 176, 8.5x10 inch heavyweight gloss pages with 200 color pictures and a very extensive three-page Index. It is very well illustrated with mostly European pictures. It should be available for \$40.00 from your favorite book seller "(ask for it,)" or from Amazon.com.



It's FREE! Participants must be registered by an active PCA member, and there is no cost to join!



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## IND POISE

uckily, my immediate family and my OCR family know my life-long obsession with Porsche, so, they're not surprised I've owned several during my lifetime. At 6'4" it's been a challenge to comfortably fit inside the various models, let alone enter and exit the driver's side. As I've aged, I must admit it doesn't get any easier, but when you're obsessed, you do what you do and make the best of it!

It all began when I saw a mustard yellow Porsche. I'd never seen a car like that or a color like that and I actually followed it from Glendale, AZ into downtown Phoenix. The owner, a Phoenix lawyer, was shocked I'd followed him for over 15 miles and I was fortunate he was happy to show me one of the first Porsche Targas. However, financially I was in the process of relocating from Arizona to California and between my Dodge truck and Porsche, one had to go. So, I put ads in the paper, thinking I'd sell whichever one caught a serious buyer's eye. Frankly, I thought it'd be the Dodge truck and never in a million years did I think it'd be the Porsche. 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


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# **Ramblings**

**BOXSTER** track ready for upgrading. Not my thing so much but in *Classic Motorsports*, January 2021 #208 this story, "*PROJECT BOXSTER S, building a Robust, Track-Ready Drivetrain,*" is worth finding and studying. A building good but brief 18-point bit on what is needed and (briefly) how to get it done; engine, ignition, oil pan, chain tensioners, water pump. A.I.S., Crank seals, H2O pump, clutch, lightweight flywheel, oil cooling thermostats, LN Engineering +2-liter oil sump pan, and under pan skid plate. *Classic Motorsports* \$6.99 at newsstands, check it out!





**Seen on LA freeway.** Is it a wreck going to shredder, or body shop, or to an eventual wish fulfilled dream? Some years ago, it would be a no brainer-junk! "BUT NOT NO MO!"

## **WAIVERS: Essential for the existence of OCR**

By Tom Gray, PCA-OCR Vice President

#### **Part One: The Adult Waiver**

**1-The Adult Waiver:** This is probably the most common and most used of all the waiver forms. **It is required for all adults attending "moving car events"** which include rallies, tours, autocross and driver education. It is not required for non-driving events such as the monthly breakfast, picnics and other dining gatherings.

#### An adult is anyone past their 18th birthday.

All persons who attend PCA events are considered "participants." Club events are by definition non-spectator events. Friends and relatives who attend must also sign the waiver.

This waiver requires the participant to print and sign their name. The signature must also be signed by a witness that actually saw the participant sign the waiver. The event name and date must be included at the top of the form.

Please be sure to sign the waiver at any event you attend where it is required.

Please assure your printed name is legible.

#### **Part Two: Waivers for Minors (All Minors)**

A minor is any person who has not yet reached their eighteenth birthday.

A minor who is admitted to any PCA event must be covered by a Minor Release and Waiver Form. There are two such forms depending upon the minor's degree of participation.

Anyone who signs as a witness should actually witness the signing.

2 - The Minor Waiver (Rider in a Parade Touring Lap Car Only): This form allows a minor to be a rider (not a driver) in a parade touring lap car.

This could include a racetrack or Autocross course at lower than competitive speed.

The requirements are similar to the "Observer Only" waiver, as follows:

One parent or quardian should print and sign their name.

Friends or other relatives are not acceptable. The form must be executed at the event on the day of the event.

The minor cannot be admitted to hot areas, except as a passenger in a car.

**3 - The Minor Waiver (Observer only) :** This form allows the minor to be admitted only to "non-hot" areas at an event.

Examples of such areas include the paddock, viewing stands, vending areas, registration areas, etc.

The waiver allows the minor to be a rider in a tour car.

"Hot" areas include the area being utilized for car handling, Autocrossing, grid and hot pits.

#### The minor cannot be admitted to a hot area.

At least one parent should print their name and sign the waiver although both parents are preferred, if available. Friends or other relatives are not acceptable to sign this waiver.

The form must be executed before a witness on the day of the event.

**4 - The Minor Waiver (Minor Waiver in Restricted Areas Driving or Riding) :** This form allows a minor to be admitted to Restricted Areas at an event, such as competition areas and hot pit.

BOTH parents or guardians are required to sign their names, NO exceptions.

Participant Minor must print and sign their name.

The waiver can be signed away from the site, but it MUST be NOTARIZED.

Unless you are at least age 16 and fully licensed (not a learner's permit or provisional) and have secured both parents signatures on the waiver, and the minor is participating in the Junior Porsche Program, you cannot be on the track or in a hot area.

## **WAIVERS: The Junior Participation Program (JPP)**

#### **Waiver for Minors : The Junior Participation Program (JPP)**

A minor is any person who has not yet reached their eighteenth birthday.

A minor who is admitted to any PCA event must be covered by a Minor Release and Waiver Form. There are two such forms depending upon the minor's degree of participation.

Anyone who signs as a witness should actually witness the signing.

PCA National has established this program in order to encourage young drivers to participate in an active manner in Club events. *Requirements to participate are more elaborate and more detailed than others because of the increased risk involved*. A driver who is fully licensed with no restrictions (except prescription eyeglasses) may participate as a driver in events such as Autocross or Gymkhana or as a Navigator in Rally.

**Conditions:** The driver must be 16 or 17 years old and fully licensed. He or she must be the child, stepchild, grandchild, niece or nephew of a PCA member. The PCA member must be in attendance at the event.

The requirement for waivers is strict and must be followed exactly. **Both parents/guardians must** sign the waiver for Minors in Restricted Areas, Driving or Riding. This waiver can be signed away from the site but if so it must be notarized.\* There are no exceptions to the rule that both parents must sign.

In addition to the parental waivers above, the minor must sign the "Minor's Assumption of Risk Acknowledgement". This form must be signed at the event and the signature must be observed and verified by a witness. PCA National requires that all waivers (except communicable disease) must contain the red portion in red. A copy machine or printer used to copy any waiver must have the capability to copy in red.
